## 3.1 EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

# 3.2 POTENTIAL HEALTH EFFECTS

## Eye Contact:

#### 4.1 FIRST AID PROCEDURES

## SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Accidental Release Measures: Evacuate unprotected and untrained personnel from hazard area. The spill should be cleaned up by qualified personnel. Remove all ignition sources such as flames, smoking materials, and electrical spark sources. Use only non-sparking tools. For large spill, or spills in confined spaces, provide mechanical ventilation to disperse or exhaust vapors, in accordance with good industrial hygiene practice. Warning! A motor could be an ignition source and could cause flammable gases or vapors in the spill area to burn or explode. Contain spill. Cover spill area with a fire-extinguishing foam. An aqueous film forming foam (AFFF) is recommended. Working from around the edges of the spill inward, cover with bentonite, vermiculite, or

commercially available inorganic absorbent material. Mix in sufficient absorbent until it appears dry. Remember, adding an absorbent material does not remove a toxic, corrosivity or flammability hazard. Clean up residue with an appropriate solvent selected by a qualified and authorized person. Ventilate the area with fresh air. Read and follow safety precautions on the solvent label and MSDS. Collect the resulting residue containing solution. Place in a metal container approved for transportation by appropriate authorities. Seal the container. Dispose of collected material as soon as possible.

# SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

#### 7.1 HANDLING

Aerosol container contains flammable gas under pressure. No smoking while handling this material. Do not spray near flames or sources of ignition. Do not pierce or burn container, even after use. Avoid static discharge. Keep away from heat, sparks, open flame, pilot lights and other sources of ignition. Avoid eye contact with vapors, mists, or spray. Avoid prolonged or repeated skin contact. Avoid breathing of vapors, mists or spray. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. Wash exposed areas thoroughly with soap and water. For industrial or professional use only.

#### 7.2 STORAGE

Store away from heat. Store out of direct sunlight.
